CONDITIONAL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER IN SABAH

Reference is made to the [MEDIA ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE SENIOR MINISTER OF DEFENCE](#) dated 5 October 2020 and the [POWERPOINT ON STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR CONDITIONAL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER IN SABAH BY THE NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL](#) dated 6 October 2020.

At the Ministers' Special Meeting held on 5 October 2020, it was decided that effective 12.01am on 7 October 2020, Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO) will be implemented for the following areas in Sabah:

1. Kota Kinabalu
2. Penampang
3. Putatan

Details of the CMCO are as follows:

1. Moving in or out from the three areas are strictly prohibited, except for residents seeking for medical treatment and movement of essential goods and services with approval from the Royal Malaysian Police/Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM).
2. Only Essential Services including factories and the related supply chain are allowed to operate.
3. The types of Essential Services are as follows:
 - i. Banking and finance
 - ii. Electricity and energy
 - iii. Fire brigade
 - iv. Port, terminal, airport services and operations
 - v. Postal service
 - vi. Jail
 - vii. Production, distillation, storage, supply and distribution of fuel and lubricants
 - viii. Medical and health care
 - ix. Solid waste management and public cleaning
 - x. Sewerage
 - xi. Radio and television transmission
 - xii. Telecommunications
 - xiii. Transportation by road, sea or air
 - xiv. Water
 - xv. E-commerce
 - xvi. Defence and security

- xvii. Food supply
- xviii. Wild life
- xix. Immigration
- xx. Customs
- xxi. Hotel and lodging
- xxii. Information technology including cloud storage and service, data and software memory
- xxiii. Electrical and electronics including semi-conductor
- xxiv. Other type of services, works or industry sectors to be determined by the Minister after consultation with the relevant authorities

The National Security Council had advised that companies involved in the Essential Services sectors and their supply chain need not obtain approval from the authorities to continue their operations. However, we advise companies to seek confirmation from the nearest police station/PDRM whether an approval is required for you to operate.

Members are also advised to strictly adhere to the Standard Operating Procedures to assist in containing further spread of the COVID-19.
